FOOD FOR THOUGHT Do what you know to do

As I write, I'm at a Starbucks in Liberty, MO, outside of Kansas City. (Yes, it's the vacay, but I didn't know what to write before we left so this.) As the week has rolled along we've had a great time doing what we want to do, resting, reading, and relaxing! I still don't know what to write exactly - there is so much afoot in our world... This morning, as I did some fishing where we're staying, all of a sudden it hit me:

"When you don't know what to do, do what you know to do."

One of the staples of my days includes reading and remembering the Psalms. One of my favorite is Psalm 121. Through the year living in Southeast Texas, I remember and recite this psalm looking forward to being among hills and mountains. When I'm out and about among the hills, these words seem to be part of my breathing:

- 1 I lift up my eyes to the hills—from where will my help come?
- 2 My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.
- 3 He will not let your foot be moved; he who keeps you will not slumber.
- 4 He who keeps Israel will neither slumber nor sleep.

- 5 The Lord is your keeper; the Lord is your shade at your right hand.
- 6 The sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night.
- 7 The Lord will keep you from all evil; he will keep your life.
- 8 The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in from this time on and forevermore.

Of course, the psalmist wrote this about being in or near Jerusalem, noting the topography of the land, from every direction, someone going to the city must pass through a valley and then "go up to Jerusalem." Yet the city itself is not the source of our help. God is. The Lord who made heave and earth is the source of our help and our very present hope! Some have taken this psalm to say that "no harm" can ever come to God's people. We know that to be different. For me, it means that whatever life brings God keeps me, God's got my back, if you will.

When I don't know what to do or think or write or pray or read, I pray this psalm.



EPIC TALES: BIBLE STORIES TO SHARE SUMMER SERMON SERIES



FOR THE LOVE OF ART — SKETCHING HOURS AT FIRST UMC

First United Methodist Church Beaumont will be opening its facilities for artists to sketch during the months of August and September as part of our For the Love of Art series.

First UMC will be open on Tuesdays in August from 11am to 3pm. Additional facility time is available by appointment. September dates and times will be announced in August.

Help us protect our collection and facility by staying 12 inches away from artwork not touching artworks, stained glass, or cases. Visitors are not permitted to enter the chancel (altar) area.

We encourage you to sketch in the sanctuary and building with only pencils and dry low-mess art media and avoid obstructing pathways for other visitors. We also encourage you to be mindful of pencil and eraser shavings and dry media residue, leaving no trace when you are finished.

We ask that parents or caregivers carry kids' pencils or sketchbooks while walking through the facility.
